### Conflict of Interest Disclosure for Outside Contributors

The International Monetary Fund seeks to observe the highest standards of professional ethics and to uphold the institution’s reputation for probity, integrity, and impartiality. Outside contributors to the work of the IMF should strive to manage their affairs in ways that uphold these standards and do not reflect adversely on the integrity of the IMF.

The disclosure guidelines below are meant to avoid conflicts of interest and are modeled on publication disclosure policies used by other professional academic associations, including the American Economic Association. The guidelines have been developed for the guidance of outside contributors to the International Monetary Fund’s online and print publications. In addition to this review of potential conflicts of interest, all submissions from outside contributors must undergo an internal review process to account for the IMF’s quality and editorial standards before any work is published. The IMF reserves the right to decline to publish.

This policy does not pertain to submissions by those who are staff, management, contractors, interns, or guest scholars of the International Monetary Fund for whom the IMF’s Code of Conduct and internal rules apply.

### Disclosure Guidelines

1. Each outside contributor of a piece submitted for publication by the International Monetary Fund (online or print) should state the sources of financial support for that particular piece of work.
2. Each outside contributor should identify each interested party from whom they have received significant financial support, summing to at least \$15,000 over the past year, in the form of consultant fees, retainers, grants and the like. An “interested” party is any individual, group, or organization that has a financial or political interest related to the piece, or could be seen to have such an interest. The disclosure requirement also includes in-kind support, such as providing access to data. If the support in question comes with a non-disclosure obligation, that fact should be stated, along with as much information as the obligation permits.
3. Each outside contributor should disclose any paid or unpaid positions as employee, consultant, advisor, officer, director, or board member of for-profit or non-profit organizations whose positions, goals, or financial interests relate to the piece.

4. Each outside contributor must disclose if another outside party has the right to review the paper prior to its circulation.
5. The IMF reserves the right to decline to publish in the event it considers that the risks of actual or perceived conflicts of interests cannot be mitigated to its satisfaction.
